CELP ACCOMPLISHMENTS

In the past year and in the face of climate change, CELP advocated to protect rivers and drinking water aquifers throughout western Washington & the Columbia River watershed.

With your help, CELP accomplished a lot, including the following highlights . . .

◆ Won a legal victory for Washington's waters in the biggest water law case of the decade, by defeating provisions of the **2003 Municipal Water Law**, which validated thousands of 'paper' water rights and immunized private developers from 'use it or lose it' laws. The case is now headed to the State Supreme Court.

◆ Protected **trumpeter swan habitat at Hines Marsh**, on the Olympic Peninsula (where swans recently returned for the first time in 40 years), by obtaining conditions in a water right to limit and monitor off-site exempt well use.

◆ Achieved unprecedented mitigation and monitoring to protect Okanogan waters in settlement of the **Buckhorn Mountain** gold mine appeal.

◆ Focused media attention on the multiple threats to waters. See **CELP's media archive** (www.celp.org) for all the articles, and be sure to read two favorite editorials:

◆ **Engaged the public** in protection of rivers and aquifers through sponsorship of:

- The first statewide Exempt Well Workshop, in Ellensburg,
- Two Columbia Dams Workshops, in the Tri-Cities & Yakima, and
- The Spokane River Flow Workshop.

◆ Undertook new efforts to enforce the 2003 **Quad Cities settlement agreement** to ensure aggressive water conservation and other protections for the Columbia River.

◆ Founded the **Benella Caminiti Public Trust Doctrine Education Fund**, to honor and continue the work of Benella, a staunch advocate for our public waterways.

CELP initiated several new campaigns to protect regional water resources, including . . .

◆ **Columbia Dam Watch** — CELP initiated a program to oppose new, environmentally harmful dams and promote sensible, sustainable water supply solutions. We founded the Columbia Water Conservation Alliance, an alliance of conservation groups and landowners, to provide a unique eastern Washington perspective on Washington's new dam program.

◆ **Wazzu Appeal** — CELP assisted Pullman-area groups in appealing Washington State University water rights, which are exacerbating serious declines in the Grande Ronde Aquifer (sole source of drinking water for the Pullman-Moscow region) in order to irrigate a new golf course.

◆ **Spokane River Flow Campaign** — CELP filed an appeal challenging conditions imposed on Avista's Spokane River Dams, to protect instream flows for Upper Spokane Falls and a struggling native redband trout population.





◆ **Exempt Well Campaign** — CELP initiated a campaign to reform Washington's exempt well laws. We petitioned Ecology (with partner Aqua Permanente) to halt exempt well drilling in Kittitas County, sponsored a workshop to educate & support similar efforts elsewhere, and will seek legislative reform in coming sessions.

◆ **Meter It/Manage It** — CELP continued its longstanding program promoting water conservation, water usage metering, stream gaging and groundwater monitoring — essential elements of sustainable water management.



How We Work: CELP's Water Rights 911 Program **You Have Water Questions—We Have Water Answers!**

Ed. Note: Because of CELP's unique expertise in water rights advocacy, we dedicate resources to assisting citizens and groups who are doing battle to protect their local waterways. In 2008 we gave a name to this program: "Water Rights 911." As one example, CELP partnered with Okanogan Highlands Alliance, a Tonasket-based group that, for years, has fought a proposed gold mine that would have destroyed beautiful Buckhorn Mountain. OHA president David Kliegman describes our partnership:

In 2000, Okanogan Highlands Alliance successfully fought a state-approved plan to allow a mining company to blow the top off of Buckhorn Mountain, in northeast Washington, and pollute local waters. The Center of Environmental Law & Policy's involvement in the 18-year fight helped even out the odds of this David vs. two Goliaths struggle against the mining company and state government itself.

In the mid 1990's CELP answered our call and got involved with our small but persistent group of Okanogan Highlands residents to protect a clean and healthy environment and the water resources upon which we depend to live and farm. CELP brought expertise, reputation, and formidable knowledge of water law to the table. Good science, good lawyers, and state laws that are written to protect the environment provided a defense that would ultimately

stop the open pit gold mine and form the basis of our efforts to permanently protect Buckhorn Mountain.

CELP participated in the challenges of the mine from the beginning and is a party to a successful agreement reached with the company in 2008. Although the agreement will allow a mine to be built - it is a very different mine from the original proposal. The underground operation will process ore at an existing off-site facility and reduce mountain impacts to a minimum. The settlement provides for long-term monitoring, allowing us to verify that the waters of the mountain and local wells will be protected. Concerns remain, but OHA and CELP will continue to keep a close eye on the Buckhorn mine and nearby waters for a very long time.

The need for CELP's statewide role is stronger than ever. CELP ensures that our laws are improved and enforced. State agencies must simply do a better job. CELP keeps watch and supports the ability of small groups like OHA to protect the public interest in a clean and healthy environment. ♦

*On the Front Cover: CELP's **Water Rights 911** program provides assistance to citizens & groups seeking to protect their local rivers and aquifers. In the past year, CELP has helped local water advocates protect some very special places, several depicted here. From left to right, top to bottom:*

- Similkameen River, near Keremeos, British Columbia (John Osborn), where a dam proposed by Okanogan PUD would flood seven miles into Canada, drown Palmer Lake, and inundate 12 abandoned mine sites.
- Petit Lake, in the Sawtooth National Recreation Area near Stanley, Idaho (John Osborn) where salmon migrate 900 miles to spawn. The Idaho Supreme Court denied water rights to protect water in the Sawtooth NRA.
- Whatcom Creek, near Bellingham (City of Bellingham), where exempt wells threaten the City's water supply.
- Sunnyside Diversion on the Yakima River, circa 1905 (photo source unknown), where irrigation diversions and water waste have extirpated several species of salmon and threaten several more.
- Icicle Creek near Leavenworth, WA (Wild Fish Conservancy), where the Leavenworth National Fish Hatchery illegally diverts water, degrading the natural stream and native fish habitat.
- Trumpeter swans at Hines Marsh, Olympic Peninsula (Guy Gerjects), where multiple exempt wells threaten avian habitat.
- Washington State University golf course, Pullman, WA (Scotty Cornelius), where the Department of Ecology has authorized the school to pump 20,000 year old water despite dramatic declines in groundwater levels.
- Sandhill cranes, Crab Creek, near Othello, WA (Kathy Admire), where the State of Washington proposes to put a new water supply dam, drowning 19,000 acres of wildlife refuge lands.
- Hamm Creek, Seattle (honoring the memory of John Beal) (RP Osborn), where the City illegally diverts water to mitigate for a new training center, despite longstanding community efforts to restore Hamm Creek.
- Grand Coulee Dam, Lake Roosevelt and Banks Lake (U.S. Bureau of Reclamation), where irrigation diversions enjoy \$500/acre/year (in 1990 \$\$) energy subsidies, to produce french fries. New diversions are proposed.
- Manastash Creek, near Ellensburg, WA (Tom Ring), where exempt wells intercept water that is already allocated to existing water users and salmon habitat.
- Hawk Creek, near Davenport, WA (John Osborn), where the State proposes to build an 800-foot dam in fractured basalt, taller than Hoover Dam, for water supply.
- Spokane River, Bowl & Pitcher, Riverside State Park (John Osborn), where instream flows have dropped to one-third their historic levels, harming water quality, recreation, and native trout habitat.
- Buckhorn Mountain rainbow (David Kliegman), where CELP & Okanogan Highlands Alliance settled an appeal to create the most heavily mitigated and monitored gold mine in history.
